Fairfield Public Measure A

SHALL THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC MEASURE BE ADOPTED?

Summary: To authorize the imposition and extension of the local option sales and services tax in the City of Fairfield, Iowa at the rate of one percent (1%), to be effective on July 1, 2019, by eliminating the scheduled repeal date of June 30, 2019.

The new local option tax will continue without repeal of the prior tax.

The local option sales and services tax shall be extended and imposed in the City of Fairfield, Iowa on July 1, 2019, by eliminating the scheduled repeal date of June 30, 2019, at the rate of one percent (1%). The new local option tax will continue without repeal of the prior tax.

Revenues from the sales and services tax imposed on July 1, 2019 shall be allocated as follows:

- a) 25% for property tax relief.
- b) The specific purposes for which the revenues shall otherwise be expended are:
  - 50% for streets & street construction projects, including planning, design, construction and debt service of said activities
  - 25% for any other lawful purpose, including community betterment.
